

Corona Virus Timeline & Facts

End of Dec 2019

Chinese authorities treated dozens of cases of pneumonia of unknown cause.

Week 2 2020

49 reported sick in Wuhan, China, The first death occurs. First case reported outside of China in Thailand.

Week 3 2020

Individuals are tested for symptoms to leave the country. Symptoms can take up to 14 days to appear. Japan and South Korea first cases.

Week 4 2020

Infected numbers jump from 314 to 581, most still in China. Wuhan is quarantined and public transportation shut down. 300,000 masks handed out

World Health Organization declares global spread emergency. 82 cases outside of China in 18 countries. 2,000 new cases in China. No deaths outside China.

9,000 cases in 21 countries, biggest quarantine in history in China. Trump administration suspends U.S. entry to foreign nationals who have been to China. U.S. is condemned by The World Health Organization. Country total goes to 24, No deaths outside of China.

Week 5 2020

Australia, New Zealand and Singapore follow United States lead refusing foreign nationals that have traveled in China. First deaths outside China in Singapore, then Hong Kong. 9,800 infected worldwide with over 300 deaths. First death occurs outside China.

Week 6 2020

Over 3,600 passengers quarantined aboard the Diamond Princess cruise ship. The Chinese doctor that tried to raise the alarm in December dies from the virus. The death toll in China surpasses 900, which is more than the entire SARS epidemic killed. There are over 14,000 new cases added to the total number of people infected.

A Chinese tourist dies while traveling in Paris. Non pharmaceutical containment measures begin around the world:
Preventing Travel
No Large Gatherings
Closing Schools
Individuals not showing symptoms now being quarantined from contact.

Week 7 2020

Over 400 passengers are offloaded from the Diamond Princess Cruise and over 200 new cases are discovered in South Korea.

Iran announces 2 cases in the country then hours later it is admitted they both had died from the virus, the source in Iran is unknown. The number of global cases has risen to almost 76,000.

Week 8 2020

Europe faces its first major outbreak as the number infected Italy jumps from 5 to over 150. 10 towns are locked down and schools, and sporting / cultural events are cancelled. Iran is identified as another point of focus for the virus.

Week 9 2020

Latin America reports it's first case. Infections in Italy surpass 800. Cases in 14 new countries can be traced back to Italy. Nigeria reports its first case which is traced back to an Italian citizen.

The first death in The United States takes place near Seattle, Washington. The number of global infections approaches 90,000. Do not travel warnings are put out by the Trump Administration.

Week 10 2020

Almost 110,000 Infected Worldwide
In 108 Countries with over 3,800 Deaths, Almost 6,000 In Serious Condition

Start of Week 11 2020

Number Infected worldwide surpasses 110,000
United States Total Cases 423, 19 Deaths, Virus found in 35 states.
Italy quarantines 25% of their population, over 16 million people.
US Stock Market Falls 2,000 points, Worst Day Since 2008

Dr. Oz on FOX states that an infected patient with the normal flu in a week would infect on average 9 others and the corona flu is closer to 45 others, 5 times more infectious

Current Advice To Stay Healthy

- Avoid close contact with people especially those that are sick.
